Get Involved: Educational Submissions for Interop Tokyo Conference

To all concerned Exhibitors;

Thank you very much for your interest in being involved with our educational program. We also appreciate your interest in being an exhibitor in Interop Tokyo 2009.

Here, we would like to introduce our **Call for Paper** system whereby we ask all participating exhibitors to submit proposals for General Conference session-themes. General Conference sessions are generally 90-minutes long. The typical session consists of a moderator and three speakers. Other formats for conference sessions are "Great Debates," in which two speakers debate a hot topic, or "In Perspective," where one speaker gives an in-depth presentation. All proposals will be decided with our domestic Program Committee through contents planning process. Planning begins ten months in advance of each conference. Your cooperation for this call for paper system would be greatly appreciated.

Proposal Process: Before you submit a proposal:

-Since the conference is well known as being neutral technical information and in principle is open to paid attendees only (except Keynotes and Special Sessions*), please review the content for technical integrity, timeliness, and interest should focus on technology, **not sales or marketing of products or solutions.**

-When submitting a proposal for each conference session-themes, please also recommend a speaker's name and his short biography as an appropriate candidate for the session themes.

**For General Conference Submission: Please review the speaker to make sure that they are qualified to present to a demanding, experienced, technical audience. Also, review the panelists to make sure there is a mix of companies, experience and technology represented.

-The proposal should be made up about one A4 page or longer in English.

-The deadline will be at most around **the beginning of December at the year before the conference** (For Interop Tokyo 2009, the deadline for session submission is December 3, 2008).

-The proposal should be made in the following format **by email (mailto: program@cmptech.jp)**

1. Session Title (including the theme - provisional title is acceptable)

2. Session Description (about 200-300 words or more)

Ref) Interop Tokyo Topics for 2009 (NGN, Data Center, Cloud Computing, Storage, Green IT, Virtualization, Security, Carrier/ISP, FMC, Mobile Business Application, Networking & Services, Wireless & Mobility, Unified Communication, Enterprise2.0, SaaS)

3. Name/Professional Bio and Areas of Expertise for the speaker: You may detail themes with which you have experience.

4. Target attendee
